Do not leave in the nostril for more than one hour 3 Prevention of re-bleeding - It may take 7-10 days for your nose to heal » Amicar® nasal spray - 1 spray to affected nostril every 4 hours while awake for 7 days following a nosebleed » Avoid forceful noseblowing » Do not strain with bowel movements Use a stool softener if necessary

The most common causes of nosebleeds include: • Nose picking - children tend to pick their noses when the air is dry and the mucous in their nose becomes crusty • Dry air - this is especially common in dry climates, or areas that use lots of indoor heating

Nosebleeds are very frequent in preschool-aged children; they are less common after puberty There are a number of possible causes, including excessive nose picking, dry air, allergies, and injuries Nosebleeds rarely signal a serious medical problem Most childhood nosebleeds come from the septum—the hard tissue between the nostrils

Patient Care Instruction Sheet: Nosebleeds

(1) Avoid digital manipulation (picking, rubbing, etc) of the nose (2) Avoid excessive nose-blowing (3) Maintaining a moist nasal environment is important and can be accomplished by gently applying Bactroban (mupirocin) ointment to the fleshy outer portion of the nostril and gently inhaling to coat the inside of the nostril
